## GOSPEL REFLECTION

### TO GO UP HIGHER: SCOTT HAHN REFLECTS ON THE 22<sup>ND</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

We come to the wedding banquet of heaven by way of humility and charity. This is the fatherly instruction we hear in today's First Reading, and the message of today's Gospel.

Jesus is not talking simply about good table manners. He is revealing the way of the kingdom, in which the one who would be greatest would be the servant of all (see Luke 22:24-27).

This is the way He showed us, humbling Himself to come among us as a man (see Philippians 2:5-8), as one who serves, as the bearer of glad tidings to the poor (see Luke 4:18).

This is the way, too, that the Father has shown us down through the ages - filling the hungry, sending the rich away empty, lifting up the lowly, pulling down the proud (see Luke 1:52-53).

We again call to mind the Exodus in today's Psalm - how in His goodness the Lord led the Israelites from imprisonment to prosperity, rained down bread from heaven, made them His inheritance, becoming a "Father of orphans."

We now too have gained a share of His inheritance. We are to live humbly, knowing we are not worthy to receive from His table (see Luke 6:7; 15:21). We are to give alms, remembering we were ransomed from sin by the price of His blood (see 1 Corinthians 6:19-20).

The Lord promises that if we are humble we will be exalted and find favor with God; that if we are kind to those who can never repay us, we will atone for sins, and find blessing in the resurrection of the righteous.

We anticipate the fulfillment of those promises in every Eucharist, today's Epistle tells us. In the Mass, we enter the festal gathering of the angels and the firstborn children of God, the liturgy of the heavenly Jerusalem in which Jesus is the high priest, the King who calls us to come up higher (see Proverbs 25:6-7).

## REFLEXIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

### SUBIR A LO ALTO: SCOTT HAHN REFLEJA SOBRE EL 22º DOMINGO DE TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Llegamos al banquete de bodas celestial por la vía de la humildad y de la caridad. Esa es la instrucción paternal que escuchamos en la primera lectura de este domingo y en el mensaje del Evangelio.

Jesús no está hablando sólo de buenos modales para la mesa. Está revelando el camino del reino, en el cual quien sea el más grande ha de ser el servidor de todos (cfr. Lc 22, 24-27).

Este es el camino que Él nos enseña al humillarse a venir y estar entre nosotros como hombre, (cfr. Flp 2,5-8), como alguien que sirve, como el portador de buenas nuevas para los pobres (cfr. Lc 4,18).

También es el camino que el Padre nos ha mostrado a lo largo de los siglos en colmar a los hambrientos, despedir a los ricos con las manos vacías, levantar a los humildes, derribar a los soberbios (cfr. Lc 1,52-53).

El salmo de esta semana nos recuerda del Éxodo: cómo Dios en su bondad guió a los israelitas de la cautividad a la prosperidad, hizo llover pan del cielo,

les hizo su heredad convirtiéndose en “Padre de los huérfanos”.

También ahora hemos logrado tener un parte de su heredad. Hemos de vivir humildemente, sabiendo que no merecemos comer de su mesa (cfr. Lc 6,7; 15,21). Hemos de dar limosna, recordando que hemos sido rescatados del pecado por el precio de su sangre (cfr. 1 Co 6,19-20).

El Señor nos promete que si somos humildes seremos exaltados y encontraremos el favor de Dios; que si somos generosos con quienes no pueden pagarnos lo que deben, compensaremos nuestros pecados y encontraremos bendición en la resurrección de los justos.

La epístola de esta semana nos dice que en cada Eucaristía anticipamos el cumplimiento de esas promesas. En la Misa entramos en la asamblea festiva de los ángeles y los primogénitos de Dios, en la liturgia de la Jerusalén celestial donde Jesús es el sumo sacerdote y el Rey que nos invita a subir a lo alto (cfr. Pr 25,6-7).

### LITURGICAL CLARIFICATION

Some parishioners have asked me to clarify what the proper position is after the Lamb of God, when the priest is holding the Body of Christ ("Behold, the Lamb of God..."). Questions have arisen since many people kneel at that time. The norm and default position in the Archdiocese of Portland for that moment is to remain standing. This is what is recommended to do for the sake of unity in the assembly. However, being aware that kneeling at that time of the Eucharist is the norm in many dioceses in the U. S. and the world, I would not object to parishioners who choose to kneel. I do want to clarify that the default position is standing, and that you should not feel out of place if you remain in that position, even though some folks do kneel.
