GOSPEL REFLECTION

DO NOT BE ANXIOUS: SCOTT HAHN REFLECTS ON THE EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

We are by nature prone to be anxious and troubled about many things.

In Sunday's Gospel, Jesus confronts us with our most common fears. We are anxious mostly about how we will meet our material needs—for food and drink; for clothing; for security for tomorrow.

Yet in seeking security and comfort, we may unwittingly be handing ourselves over to servitude to “mammon,” Jesus warns. “Mammon” is an Aramaic word that refers to money or possessions.

Jesus is not condemning wealth. Nor is he saying that we shouldn't work to earn our daily bread or to make provisions for our future.

It is a question of priorities and goals. What are we living for? Where is God in our lives?

Jesus insists that we need only to have faith in God and to trust in his Providence.

The readings this Sunday pose a challenge to us. Do we really believe that God cares for us, that he alone can provide for all our needs?

Do we believe that he loves us more than a mother loves the infant at her breast, as God himself promises in this week's beautiful First Reading? Do we really trust that he is our rock and salvation, as we sing in the Psalm?

Jesus calls us to an intense realism about our lives. For all our worrying, none of us change the span of our days. None of us has anything that we have not received as a gift from God (see [1 Cor. 4:7](#)).

St. Paul reminds us in the Epistle that when the Lord comes he will disclose the purposes of every heart.

We cannot serve both God and mammon. We must choose one or the other. Our faith cannot be partial. We must put our confidence in him and not be shaken by anxiety.

Let us resolve today to seek his Kingdom and his holiness before all else—confident that we are beloved sons and daughters, and that our Father in heaven will never forsake us.

REFLEXIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

NO SE PREOCUPEN: SCOTT HAHN REFLEJA SOBRE EL 8º DOMINGO DE TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Por naturaleza, estamos inclinados a la ansiedad y preocupación.

En el evangelio de este domingo, Jesús nos confronta con nuestros miedos más comunes. Estamos ansiosos por nuestras necesidades materiales, por comida y bebida, ropa, seguridad en el futuro.

Sin embargo, buscando seguridad y comodidad, podemos caer en la esclavitud de Mamnon sin querer. Mamnon viene del arameo y representa dinero o posesiones.

Jesús no condena riqueza. Tampoco está diciendo que no debemos trabajar y ganar nuestro pan de cada día o hacer provisiones para el futuro.

Es una cuestión de prioridades y metas. ¿Por qué vivimos? ¿Qué lugar tiene Dios en nuestras vidas?

Jesús insiste que necesitamos tener fe en Dios y confiar en su providencia.

Las lecturas de este domingo suponen un desafío para nosotros. ¿Realmente creemos que Dios nos cuida, qué solo Él puede proveer todas nuestras necesidades?

¿Creemos que Él nos ama a nosotros más que una madre ama al niño a quien está dando pecho, como Dios nos dice en la primera lectura? ¿Confiamos de

verdad que Él es nuestra roca y nuestra salvación, como cantamos en el Salmo?

Jesús nos llama a un realismo intensivo sobre nuestras vidas. A pesar de nuestra preocupación, no podemos agregar “un codo a la medida de nuestra vida.” Nadie tiene algo que Dios no le ha dado (cfr. 1 Co 4:7).

San Pablo nos recuerda en la epístola que cuando venga el Señor, el revelara las intenciones de todos los corazones.

No podemos servir a Dios y a Mamnon. Nos toca escoger uno u el otro. Nuestra fe no puede ser parcial. Tenemos que confiar en Él y no asustarnos.

Hagamos el propósito hoy de buscar su Reino y su santidad sobre todas las cosas, confiados que somos sus amados hijos e hijas y que nuestro Padre en el cielo nunca nos abandonara.
