GOSPEL REFLECTION

COUNTING THE COST: SCOTT HAHN REFLECTS ON THE 23RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Like a king making ready for battle or a contractor about to build a tower, we have to count the cost as we set out to follow Jesus.

Our Lord today is telling us upfront the sacrifice it will take. His words aren't addressed to His chosen few, the Twelve, but rather to the "great crowds" - to "anyone," to "whoever" wishes to be His disciple.

That only makes His call all the more stark and uncompromising. We are to "hate" our old lives, renounce all the earthly things we rely upon, to choose Him above every person and possession. Again He tells us that the things we have - even our family ties and obligations - can become an excuse, an obstacle that keeps us from giving ourselves completely to Him (see Luke 9:23-26, 57-62).

Jesus brings us the saving Wisdom we are promised in today's First Reading. He is that saving Wisdom.

Weighed down by many earthly concerns, the burdens of our body and its needs, we could never see beyond the things of this world, could never detect God's heavenly design and intention. So in His mercy He sent us His Spirit, His Wisdom from on High, to make straight our path to Him.

Jesus himself paid the price for to free us from the sentence imposed on Adam, which we recall in today's Psalm (see Genesis 2:7; 2:19). No more will the work of our hands be an affliction, no more are we destined to turn back to dust.

Like Onesimus in today's Epistle, we have been redeemed, given a new family and a new inheritance, made children of the father, brothers and sisters in the Lord.

We are free now to come after Him, to serve Him - no longer slaves to the ties of our past lives. In Christ, all our yesterdays have passed. We live in what the Psalm today beautifully describes as the daybreak of His kindness. For He has given us wisdom of heart, taught us to number our days aright.

REFLEXIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

CONSIDERAR EL PRECIO: SCOTT HAHN REFLEJA SOBRE EL 23º DOMINGO DE TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Como un rey que se prepara para batalla o un constructor que está a punto de construir una torre, cuando nos disponemos a seguir a Jesús debemos considerar el precio de lo que ello implica.

En las lecturas de esta semana, Nuestro Señor nos dice francamente el sacrificio que exige seguirle. Sus palabras no están dirigidas a sus pocos escogidos, los Doce, sino a las “grandes multitudes”, a “todo aquel” que quiera ser su discípulo.

Eso hace que su llamada sea de lo más intransigente y duro. Hemos de “odiar” nuestras viejas vidas, renunciar a todas las cosas terrenas en las que confiamos, para escogerlo a Él por encima de toda persona o posesión. De nuevo nos dice que las cosas que tenemos –incluso nuestros lazos y obligaciones familiares– pueden convertirse en una excusa, un obstáculo que nos impide darnos completamente a Él (cfr. Lc 9,23-26; 57-62).

Jesús nos trae la sabiduría de salvación que se nos promete en la primera lectura de este domingo. Él es esa Sabiduría que salva.

Sobrecargados por nuestras preocupaciones terrenas, por los agobios de nuestro cuerpo y sus

necesidades, nunca podríamos ver más allá de las cosas de este mundo ni detectar jamás el diseño celestial ni las intenciones de Dios. Por eso, en su misericordia, nos manda su Espíritu, su Sabiduría de lo alto, para allanarnos el camino hacia Él.

Jesús mismo pagó el precio para liberarnos de la pena impuesta a Adán, que recordamos en el salmo de esta semana (cfr. Gn 2,7; 3,19). Ya no será una aflicción el trabajo de nuestras manos; ya no estamos destinados a volver al polvo.

Como Onésimo en la epístola de este domingo, hemos sido redimidos; se nos ha dado una nueva familia y heredad; hemos sido convertidos en hijos del Padre, hermanos y hermanas en el Señor.

Ahora somos libres de venir a Él, de servirle; no somos más esclavos de las ataduras de nuestras vidas pasadas. En Cristo, todo nuestro ayer ha pasado. Vivimos en lo que el salmo describe bellamente como el amanecer de su bondad. Por él se nos ha dado sabiduría de corazón, se nos ha enseñado a calcular nuestros años correctamente.

LITURGICAL CLARIFICATION

"Some parishioners have asked me to clarify what the proper position is after the Lamb of God, when the priest is holding the Body of Christ ("Behold, the Lamb of God..."). Questions have arisen since many people kneel at that time. The norm and default position in the Archdiocese of Portland for that moment is to remain standing. This is what is recommended to do for the sake of unity in the assembly. However, being aware that kneeling at that time of the Eucharist is the norm in many dioceses in the U. S. and the world, I would not object to parishioners who choose to kneel. I do want to clarify that the default position is standing, and that you should not feel out of place if you remain in that position, even though some folks do kneel."
